Child porn photos lead to arrest

The action comes 11 months after authorities confiscated college student's computer.

Authorities arrested a man on suspicion of possessing child pornography Monday, saying he had been found with more than 1,000 images of child pornography, including graphic photos showing bondage and torture of girls as young as 10.

Siquerio Mateo Olander-Rios 25, was a student at California State University, Sacramento, when authorities seized his computer last May after a tip from a fellow student that Olander-Rios was accessing and viewing child pornography in the school's dormitories, said Sacramento County Sheriff's Lt. Bob Lozito.

In the ensuing 11 months, the Sheriff's Department teamed with the FBI to investigate the case. Authorities sent the images to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, which identified 37 children in its database as victims of the pornography.

He was arrested near his apartment at Fair Oaks Boulevard and Howe Avenue.

Olander-Rios is expected to be charged under federal law, which is more stringent than state law, Lozito said.

The quantity of images and their graphic nature could result in Olander-Rios spending up to 20 years behind bars, Lozito said.

"A thousand (images) is not going to necessarily ring any bells in terms of volume, but what we focused in on is this person is looking at images of children in bondage and being tortured," Lozito said. "Possession of child pornography is a violation, and the enhancement is the potential that it depicts bondage and torture."

Lozito said it does not appear that Olander-Rios was trading or selling the images.

Olander-Rios will appear before U.S. Magistrate Judge Kimberly Mueller at 2 p.m. today for a detention hearing.
